Bacari recommendations in Venice

Al Timon. It is full of Venetians (some exchange students too). The quality is okay, and the prices are good. In front of the bar there is a boat on the canal and you can jump on it and sit there to have your *spritz* and *ciccheti*!

Vino Vero. It is on the same fondamenta of the Timon, but the fare is of higher quality. They have only (very good) wine, natural or biological. The ciccheti are claimed to be the best in Venezia. Warmly recommended!

The Fondamenta Ormesini is full of bacari, so a bit crowded, but mostly of students/PhDs/Venetian. It is nice to go there if you want to join a bit of movida.

Osteria al ponte. It is next to the hospital (Ospedale S Giovanni e Paolo!). It is not so crowded and the spritz are good and cheap.

Bacarando in corte dell'Orso. It is close to Rialto, inside a small *calle*. It has a good offer of *ciccheti*.

Cantina Do Spade. It has the best offer of fried *ciccheti* (polpette fritte, chele di granchio, mozzarelle in carrozzat, etc.). It also has a restaurant. But the great fried *ciccheti* are not served in the restaurant. On the weekends it is super crowded.

Enoteca Schiavi. Close to the Accademia bridge, it has good *ciccheti*, not expensive. There are many students here too, but it is a nice place to go and to drink. Warning: there are many seagulls and if they want your food they can be very aggressive!

Osteria al squero. Next to "Enoteca Schiavi". It is very similar.
